The Milwaukee Road shops built eight baggage dormitory cars for the Milwaukee Road in 1947. Milwaukee Road Cars 1306-1309 were painted Union Pacific colors and were originally assigned for summer use to the City of Los Angeles. The cars also saw service on the Olympian Hiawatha.

The dormitory sections contained three compartments each with a sleeping capacity of six. There was also a compartment for stewards which slept two persons.

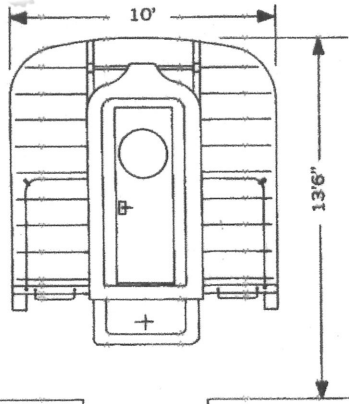
The cars measured 75' 0" overall and were highly distinctive with their uniquely Milwaukee Road port hole and oval windows.

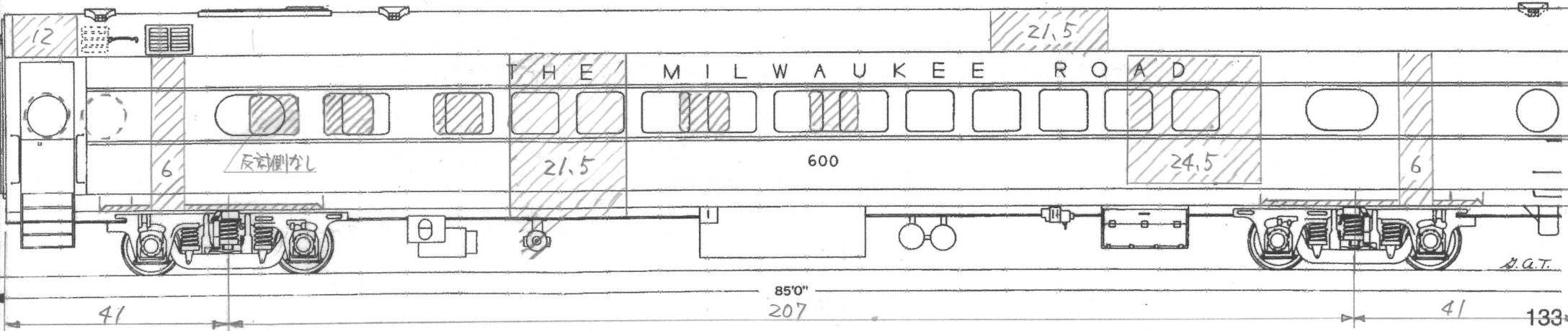
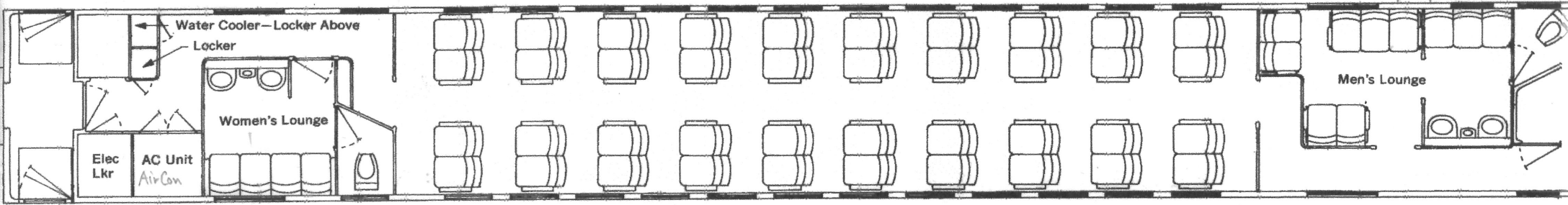
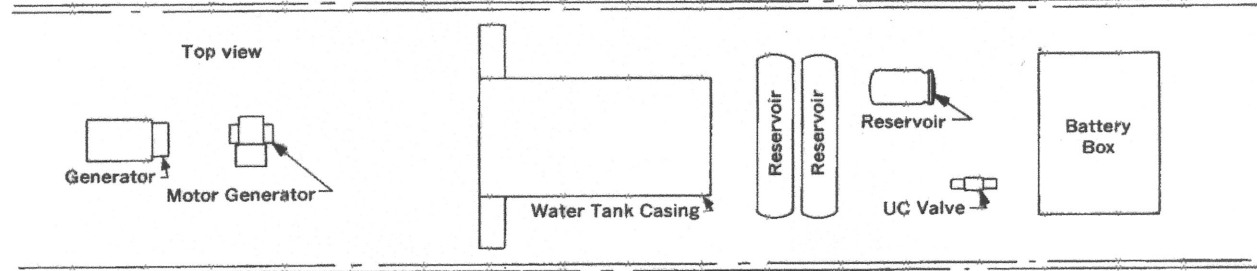
